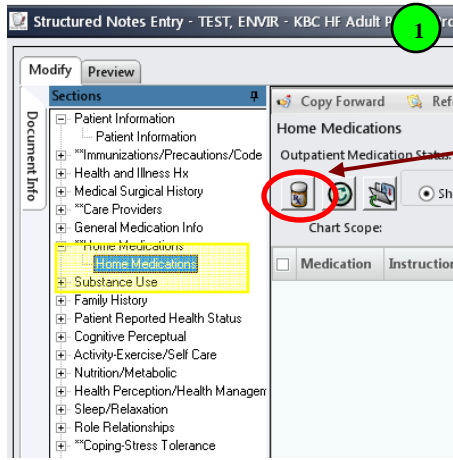




Managing Home Medications



- The **Outpatient Medication Review (OMR)** may be accessed via the **Toolbar** icon  OR
- Directly from the **Patient Profile** or **ED Primary Assessment Document** under the **Home Medications** section 
- Home Meds may already be visible from a previous visit, an ED visit or from Pre-Op documentation, but **MUST be reviewed** by the holding or floor RN.
- Meds entered in **OMR** will populate the **Medication Reconciliation** section of the Order Sets to be completed by the physician entering orders electronically; therefore it is **CRITICAL** they be entered **ASAP** and accurately.

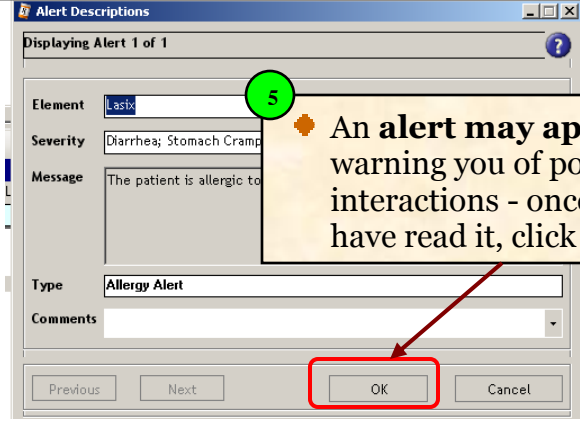
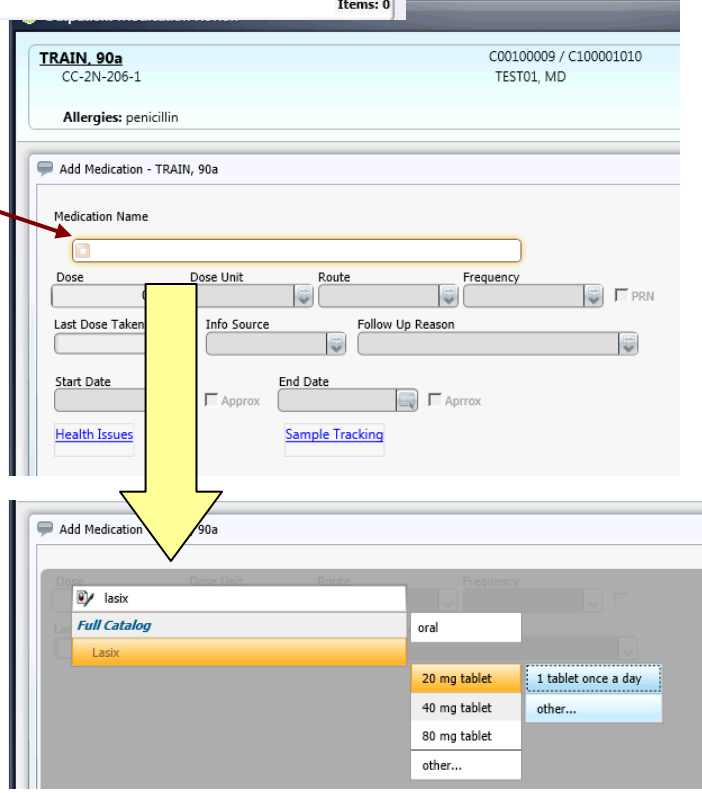


- The **OMR** opens. 2
- Note the **Allergies** listed in the Header. If these have not yet been added, you can add them from here.



- Click the **Plus Sign** on the left to enter Home Meds. 3

- Using the **Medication Name** window, begin typing the first few letters of the **home medication** you would like to add.
- Click the medication and a list of available forms of that medication will appear.
- Click on the form, dose and route applicable to your patient and it will appear in the drug search window.
- If the form, dose and routes are not available, you may choose **"Other"**.



- An **alert** may appear warning you of potential interactions - once you have read it, click **OK**.

- The **Dose, Dose Unit, Route & Frequency** auto-populates if chosen from the list.
- If **“Other”** is chosen, the fields need to be manually filled in.
- Complete the **Frequency** field.

Do not forget to fill in **Date and Time** of the **Last Dose** taken. (If the patient has a Home Med profile from a previous visit, ensure that Last Dose is updated).

If the patient or family is unsure of the medication details, the med in question can be “flagged” with a **Follow Up** reason.

Click **Save** if you are finished adding Home Meds, or click **Add Another**, if you want to continue.

The medications will be **listed in the OMR**. From here they can be **Modified** or **Marked as No Longer Taking**, by **Right Clicking** or by using the **Icons** to the right of the med.

Click **Save Complete** or **Save Incomplete**.

If you hover over the **Review Status**, you can see the date that the med list was updated.
